Nehemiah 9:1-10:39

1. Read Nehemiah 9:1-4. What evidence of genuine revival is found in these verses?
  
2. Nehemiah 9:5-37 is a long, instructional prayer recounting the spiritual history of the Jews, highlighting God's grace and faithfulness in contrast to Israel's pride and rebellion. Read 9:5-15 and note what is recorded about God's character and conduct.
  
3. Read Nehemiah 9:16-31. How did the Jews respond to God's grace and faithfulness? How are we guilty of the same things today? (vv. 16-17, 26, 28-30)
  
4. God is often wrongly accused of being a God of wrath in the Old Testament and a God of love in the New Testament. What words describe God's character as revealed in his response to his people's repeated rebellion?
  
5. Read Nehemiah 9:32-37. What did they ask of God even as they continued to confess their sins?
  
6. Read Nehemiah 9:38-10:29. What action did the people agree to take in 9:38? Who was involved? (10:1-29) What pledge did they make? (10:29)
  
7. Read Nehemiah 10:30-39. What specific areas were addressed?
